AFTER THE i-SAFE PROGRAM

Of Students Polled:

- **97% of students in grades 3 through 4 agree they will tell a parent, guardian, or trusted adult when someone online makes them feel uncomfortable.***
- **81% of students in grades 5 through 12 report being less likely to meet someone they have only met online face to face.****
- **59% of students in grades 5 through 12 are more careful about where they go and what they do online.*****
- **56% of students have discussed Internet safety issues with their parents.****
- **41% of students in grades 5 through 12 report being more careful when sharing personal information online.****
- **39% of students report making better choices about what is legal to download from the Internet.**
